## Key Accomplishments of Reporting Year

In FY 15, Fairview made significant advances in contributing to a healthier southern Berkshire service area through the launching of the Canyon Ranch Institute's Life Enhancement Program and collaborating with Berkshire Medical Center's PWTF and the Berkshire Partnership for Health, bringing important health services to hundreds of people in our community identified as at-risk. In addition, Fairview expanded cardiology services, including cardiopulmonary rehabilitation services, as well as nutrition and diabetes education and management programs, which address significant health issues facing our community. Free education programs and increased collaboration with area events provided more engagement with our communities and the people we serve. Noting the priority issue of access to physicians, Fairview Hospital continues to play a role in strengthening access to medical care through physician recruitment in both primary and specialty care services, improving access in a traditionally underserve rural community. Fairview Hospital also served as a launching partner of the Summer Backpack Program, tied to at-risk elementary students, whose families face food insecurity during summer months.

### **Plans for Next Reporting Year**

Fairview Hospital will continue to focus on overarching issues of access to healthcare, chronic disease management, prevention and education, as well as community building and the continued development of a medical community and a strong rural emergency network. In addition, Fairview will expand efforts and resources in other key priority areas including substance and opioid abuse treatment and prevention, driver safety and pertussis prevention.

In FY15, Fairview provided 27 unique patients safe, supportive, clinically monitored programs to improve their quality of life.

Cardiac disease patients will have access to high quality, evidence-based cardiac rehabilitation to improve health status.

In FY15, 70 unique cardiac patients participated in Fairview's Cardiac Rehabilitation Program. Planning was conducted to offer a Cardiac Rehab Maintenance Program in FY16.

Fairview will remove barriers to care for those seeking cardiac rehabilitation but struggling with the financial burden.

Fairview Hospital established a fund to assist individuals with co-pays. Two patients utilized this fund to access care.

Diabetes services will be expanded to meet increasing need.

In FY15, Fairview provided service to 76 unique diabetic

Diabetic educators and nutritionists will provide individual and group counseling and support for diabetics, as well as outreach to raise awareness among pre-diabetics.

patients and participated in health fairs and outreach to raise awareness of the disease and available programs in our community.

Cardiac survivors will have access to the emotional and clinical support that helps them maintain and improve their health status during and after cardiac rehabilitation. Fairview's Cardiac Rehabilitation team established a new support group, "HeartBeats" which is lead by a social worker and held twice a month.

Fairview's medical staff provide ongoing quality assessment and quality improvement feedback by conducting reviews of pre-hospital care reports for area responders.

Fairview will participate in a broad regional collaborative to improve the health status tied to high risk health issues facing our community. Working together for a healthier community, Fairview staff will support, participate in and offer programs in South County. Fairview Hospital has been involved in the planning and implementation of the PWTF Grant which is known as the Berkshire Partnership for Health.

The health status of our community will be improved by providing nutrition and lifestyle education and support to children and families. Operation Better Start offered two 8-week Mindful Eating programs, Take 6 for Teens and individualized counseling serving 58 individuals.

Individuals with an identified health need will have access to a free program to help make life-improving change. Fairview launched Canyon Ranch Institute's Life Enhancement Program in South Count. In FY15, Fairview invested in extensive planning and implemented two twelve session/3-hour weekly meetings, serving 40 individuals with integrated health and wellness.

Fairview Hospital eagerly supports local initiatives to improve access to nutritious food among vulnerable Fairview provided 443 pounds of prepared food to the homeless shelter, food for 21 families in the Summer Backpack

populations. program for economically vulnerable children, and provided financial support to the local food pantry to support its resources.

Fairview contributes to a more environmentally sustainable community through its commitment to recycling and composting. Fairview leads the community in establishing new environmentally friendly standards, including evidenced by 30.53 tons of materials composted from food service operations.

Access to vaccination immunization at no charge for children and rural elders. Fairview provided 3 school-based/4 rural community based clinics that offered children, families and community members access to influenza vaccination and immunization at no charge to them. A total of 373 individuals received vaccinations.

Individuals with hypertension will be offered a comprehensive program to monitor and improve their health status. Fairview Hospital offered the "Get Cuffed" Program to 35 individuals in the community, extending the impact of Berkshire Medical Center's program located in Pittsfield.

Individuals at risk for falls will have access to education and support to improve balance and decrease risk. In FY15, 25 individuals participated in The Matter of Balance program designed to decrease the risk of falls for the elderly.

Pre-diabetics will have In FY15, 23 benefited access to information, from individual and screening and services group counseling. to identify their pre-diabetic condition.
